The Stolowe Mountains are a very attractive area and well maintained from a tourist point of view. The Park area is cut through by a dense network of tourist trails, whose total length is about 100 km



The movement of tourists here is mainly towards the landscapes, and concentrates on the region of the Errant Rocks and Szczeliniec Wielki. 


> In the Stolowe Mts National Park rock climbing is allowed in places appointed by the regulation. Climbing is allowed only form April 15 to November 3

In the area of Stolowe Mts NP in winter there also available skiing routes. The relief and picturesque landscapes only help to practise this sport. There are three main routes which are appointed in such a way that you can go around almost the whole park. The central point is in Karlow where there is a proper tourist base.



EDUCATION

The Centre in Stolowe Mountains was created on the 17th September 1996 and since than has been carrying on ecological education aiming at all social and age groups.
